At the moment, we are still planning to hold a short service on Christmas morning, Saturday 25th at 9.45am led by Kathy. Decisions about the scheduled service for 2nd January will depend on what restrictions may be in place by then. We are still planning to have this service but will keep you updated if circumstances change.

Of course, we will continue to serve for the foreseeable future and do our best to keep the church open as we have been doing, but the New Year will have to see some changes. Please prayerfully consider this situation.
